- Known as the Valley Isle
 - Located in the center of the Hawaiian chain and is the second largest of the islands
 - 48 miles long and 26 miles wide, totaling 728 square miles
 - The highest point is 10,023 ft at the summit of Mount Haleakala
 - Haleakala's crater is 21 miles across and 4,000 ft deep – large enough to hold the island of Manhattan
 - Maui was formed by the lava of two volcanoes; Pu'u Kekai in the west and Mount Haleakala to the south
