



ABOUT MAUI

- Known as the Valley Isle
- Located in the center of the Hawaiian chain and is the second largest of the islands
- 45 miles long and 26 miles wide, totaling 729 square miles
- The highest point is 10,023 ft. at the summit of Mount Haleakala
- Haleakala's crater is 21 miles across and 4,000 ft deep - large enough to hold the island of Manhattan
- Maui was formed by the lava of two volcanoes; Pe'u Kikai in the west and Mount Haleakala to the south

ABOUT KAPALUA RESORT

- Encompasses nearly 23,000 acres, from Pe'u Kikai, the highest peak in West Maui, to the Pacific Ocean
